

The SLOW work is explained on the other page.




Stedman Hints to start

Stedman has some new pieces of work to learn

names are traditional you just have to learn them


Note: Blue text means Backstroke actions

lead 'right': the 1st blow is a HAND stroke lead 'wrong': the 1st blow is a BACK stroke when you lead *more quickly* than the following hand stroke



SLOW WORK uses these new pieces of work

This is all done in 3rd place or below



ACTION AT A SINGLE

(there are no Bobs)

The only bells affected are those doing BACK work, the double dodges UP and DOWN in 4th & 5th place

When the call is made. if you are dodging:

UP do CAT'S EARS

DOWN do REVERSE CAT'S EARS (Coathangers).


In both cases the work you do *after* the single is the same as the work you were doing *before*; (either QUICK or SLOW).

The effect of the single is to swap positions of the two dodging bells.

The singles examples below are for the treble, shown by the thicker red line.


1. Treble making Cat's Ears

Call made at the Treble up-dodge



2. Treble making Reverse Cat's Ears

Call made at the Treble down-dodge



Two consecutive singles are possible but there is not space to describe them here.
