## YOUNG RINGER OF THE YEAR COMPETITION

(for the George Wareham Trophy)

The trophy is presented at the Annual General Meeting on Easter Monday

The winner also receives £150,  $2^{nd}$  - £75,  $3^{rd}$  - £40, and any ringer not placed

 $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  or  $3^{rd}$  and scoring over 200 points will also receive £20.

# RULES

- 1. Any member of the Association who is 18 or under on the closing date can enter.
- 2. The competition runs for a year, from 1<sup>st</sup> March to 28<sup>th</sup>/29<sup>th</sup> February.
- 3. Each person can only enter one award or competition each year either the 'Young Ringer Award' or the 'Young Ringer of the Year Competition'.
- 4. The entry form for the 'Young Ringer of the Year Competition', with each entry initialled by an adult member of the band, should be checked and signed by the Tower Captain, Tutor or appointed adult member of the band after 28<sup>th</sup>/29<sup>th</sup> February.
- 5. The form should then be sent to the Branch Education Officer, who will forward it to the Association Education Officer by 21<sup>st</sup> March.

# WHAT TO DO

- 1. Obtain a copy of the entry form by printing it from the website or by having it posted to you by the Association Education Officer.
- 2. Before 1<sup>st</sup> March ask your Tower Captain or Tutor to cross the boxes of the Achievements on the list that you can already ring consistently without a mistake and strike well.
- 3. Each time you ring ask an adult member of the band to initial that you have completed the Practice Night or Service Ringing part of the form accurately.
- 4. When you can consistently ring a new method without making a mistake and strike it well your Tower Captain or Tutor may initial this box for you.
- 5. When you attend a Branch Practice, Course, Outing, etc; or an Association event; or ring at a new tower ask the Ringing Master or adult taking you to initial your completed form.
- 6. When you ring a Quarter Peal or Peal, ask the Conductor to initial your completed form.
- 7. After 28<sup>th</sup>/29<sup>th</sup> February add up the points you have scored in all the sections and enter this in the total box. Give it to your Tower Captain or Tutor to check, countersign and forward to the Branch Education Officer who will forward it to the Association Education Officer.
- 8. You may include other methods not listed on the form. Add them in the spare boxes and then continue on the back of the sheet or on an extra sheet of paper. Variations of methods cannot be included.
- 9. When ringing touches of a method you must be able to ring both the bobs and the singles if the method uses both calls.
- 10. You may complete the Achievements in any order.
- 11. If you run out of space on the form for new towers, quarter peals, etc, continue on the back of the form or on an extra sheet of paper.

- 12. An adult member of the band should keep a register of attendance on practice nights and at service ringing.
- 13. The points that you receive are as follows:
  - a. For each achievement initialled by your Tower Captain/Tutor 4 points
  - b. For each practice night that you attend 1 point
  - c. For each service that you ring for 2 points
  - d. For each branch event that you attend 6 points
  - e. For each tower that you ring at for the first time 2 points
  - f. For the first quarter peal that you ring 8 points
  - g. For each quarter peal that you ring after your first quarter 4 points
  - h. For the first peal that you ring 16 points
  - i. For each peal that you ring after your first peal 8 points
  - j. For conducting your first quarter peal 8 points
  - k. For conducting each quarter peal after your first 6 points
  - I. For conducting your first peal 16 points
  - m. For conducting each peal after your first 12 points

### ACHIEVEMENTS

It is in the interest of the development of the young person's ringing skills that they are able to perform each achievement to a high standard regularly before it is signed off.
